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On 21<sup>st</sup> February, Maunsell Third Class Open coach 1381 turned up at the Norden Road/Rail interchange, and Guard Paul Simons was there to record the event.

It had been at Rampart Engineering at Barrow Hill near Chesterfield for external overhaul, and is one of a pair of these coaches presently in the process of being restored for use on the railway.



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
